Be an advocate by voting this November in the General Election!

In addition to electing a President and Vice President, voters will also be voting for a Senator in both New York and New Jersey, all members of the US House of Representatives, and many statewide and local officials.



Ensure you are ready to vote by following these simple steps:

- 1) **Register to vote or check your registration status.**
 - a. Voter lists are sometimes cleaned up, meaning you may have been removed.
 - b. Be sure that your address is up to date with your local Board of Elections.
- 2) **Learn who will be on your ballot.** Visit the election website for your state, below, to see a sample ballot. You can also visit www.vote411.org for information on all 50 states.
- 3) **Make a plan to vote early in person, by mail or in-person on Election Day.** Learn more below.

ELECTION DATES AND DEADLINES

In-Person Election Day Voting: Tuesday, November 5

Early In-Person Voting: Saturday, October 26 to Sunday, November 3

Registration Deadlines	Register online, in-person or by mail. Registration must be received by Saturday, October 26* <small>*Mailed applications must be postmarked by Monday, October 21.</small>	Register online or by mail. Registration must be received by Tuesday, October 15.
Mail Ballot Request Deadline	Any registered voter may apply for an early mail ballot. Request a mail ballot online through the state website, by mail or with your County Board of Elections by Saturday, October 26.	Any registered voter may apply for to vote by mail. Request to vote by mail through your county. Forms can be found online and must be sent to your country clerk before Tuesday, October 29.
Absentee / Mail Ballot Return Deadline	Ballots must be returned to your County Board of Elections Office, dropped off at a polling site on Election Day, or postmarked by Tuesday, November 5 at 9 PM.	Ballots must be returned to a Ballot Drop Box in your county, returned to your County Board of Elections Office, or postmarked by Tuesday, November 5 at 8 PM.
